Mairi MacLennan, P7 Sgoil nan Loch and Hamish Scott, S1 Sir E Scott School attended an awards ceremony at the House of Lords on Monday the 16th of May.

They had taken part in a poetry and art competition commemorating the First World War organised by the charity Never Such Innocence.

Mairi won first prize for art in her section and was awarded with a certificate and a £500 prize fund, half for herself and half for her school.

Hamish, who wrote a poem about Scapa Flow and the First World War, received a certificate and a special commendation and he will attend the Royal Navy Battle of Jutland Commemorations in Edinburgh at the end of this month.

Both received a commemorative booklet with the art work and poems of all the winners and runners up from the 2015 -2016 competition from across Britain and the Commonwealth.

Comhairle Convener, Norman A MacDonald, said: "I would like to congratulate Mairi and Hamish on their recent success in the poetry and art competition commemorating the First World War. It is good to see our young people taking part in these competitions; the First World War is a constant reminder to us all as islanders of the sacrifices made by so many."

Mairi and Hamish received a contribution towards their travel costs from Comunn na Gàidhlig and Comhairle nan Eilean Siar.

Pesticide use and Sheep Shearing Training Opportunities

The Muaitheabhal Trust would like to gauge interest in a Safe Use of Pesticide course (PA1) and associated supporting courses in using Hand Held Applicator (PA2) and Ground Crop Sprayer (PA6), and a Sheep Shearing course.

The cost for the Pesticides courses per participant will be: PA1-£100 (MCWFT will contribute £100 towards the costs of this course, per participant living in the Muaitheabhal Trust area).

PA2 - £195 (MCWFT will contribute £150 towards the costs of this course, per participant living in the Muaitheabhal Trust area).

PA6 - £190 (MCWFT will contribute £100 towards the cost of this course, per participant living in the Muaitheabhal Trust area).

Grandfather Rights - £195 (MCWFT will contribute £150 towards this course, per participant – living in the Muaitheabhal Trust area).

The proposed dates for this training are week beginning 15th August: Monday - PA1, Tues - PA6, Wed - PA2.

Each day requires a day of assessment at a later date, to be confirmed. Please contact us for further details on each course.

The cost for the Shearing Course per participant will be:

Sheep Shearing beginners - £80 (MCWFT will contribute £100 towards the costs of this course, per participant living in the Muaitheabhal Trust area).



Refresher Course - £25 (MCWFT will contribute £20 towards the costs of this course, per participant living in the Muaitheabhal Trust area).

The proposed dates for this training are 16th & 17th June. Places will be allocated on a first come first served basis, so please respond as soon as you can if you are interested.

Muaitheabhal Trust will be paying for the travel and accommodation of the trainers for the training days and the assessment days.

Work starts at Gravir Playpark thanks to Tesco's Bags of Help campaign


Pairc Community Council has started work on its Playpark project in Gravir following its successful receipt of £10,000 from Tesco's Bags of Help campaign.

The supermarket teamed up with Groundwork to launch its Bags of Help initiative, which saw grants of £12,000, £10,000 and £8,000 – all raised from the 5p bag levy – being awarded to environmental and greenspace projects. Eight million shoppers voted in stores up and down the country.

The project involves removal of the old mini roundabout; this will be replaced with a new much larger roundabout. The roundabout upgrade includes wheelchair access. We will also be installing a 1.85m freestanding slide.



Pairc Community Chair Paul Bailey would like to take this opportunity to thank Tesco for this fabulous award; "the money will enable us to make a great difference to peoples enjoyment of the playpark. Previously we could not afford to buy the equipment; now, over £9,000 of the award is going directly towards cost of equipment."



"This is the really exciting part of the project – seeing the projects coming to life thanks to the funding and we can't wait to follow the projects right through to the end."

Pairc Community Council would also like to thank Muaitheabhal Community Windfarm Trust for their support, by providing a bridging loan to cover the period between the equipment being purchased and the payment of the grant.

Community Skips in Pairc

Following on from the recent dumping of large amounts of prohibited material in the Community Skips in Pairc, they are to be removed from the area with immediate effect.

Pairc Community Council were reluctant to take this action, however, there was no other option. The present management system for the skips is not working properly to stop this prohibited material getting into the skips.

Hopefully this will be a temporary measure. In order to get the skips returned, we will need a more robust management system for the skips in place.

Before the skips return, we will need to prove to the Comhairle we have proper procedures in place; for example, having the skip in a chain link compound, only opening the skips at certain times under full supervision or setting up a new management team, responsible for all matters skip related, to name but a few ideas.

Pairc Community Council would appreciate any input or suggestions you may have with regard to the best way forward.

Dementia Cafés in Lochs area go from strength to strength!

Marion MacInnes Service Manager of Alzheimer Scotland says "We are delighted that the Muaitheabhal Trust has awarded us a grant of £2323 for 2016/17 to continue and develop the Dementia Café/Carer Drop-in Sessions in North and South Lochs."

Attendance is steadily increasing as people are becoming more aware of the monthly events through posters, advertising, health and social care colleagues and of course word of mouth. The dementia cafés offer an opportunity for people to have a meeting place and to remain connected to their local communities. There are also examples of people connecting with new friends and reconnecting with old friends and neighbours.



The next dementia café at Ravenspoint falls on Wednesday 1st June 2016; this is in the middle of National Dementia Awareness Week 30th May - 5th June 2016. Alzheimer Scotland have extended an open invitation to this event in June to the local community in Lochs.
